

Prescreening Instructions:

- *Video is required for all prescreening recordings. The recorded videos must be unedited, but full movements can be recorded separately. Piano accompaniment is preferred but not required.*
- *Please note that smaller file sizes may yield faster and easier upload times from most home internet connections and will be of sufficient quality for faculty review. Please check to ensure your videos are fully processed before submitting your application on Acceptd (undergraduate) or Slate (graduate).*

Prescreening & Audition:

Please prepare the following:

- Bach prelude and fugue
- A first movement of a sonata by Haydn, Mozart, or Beethoven
- A representative work of the Romantic period or 20th century
- Virtuoso etude

Please note that all works should be performed from memory, with the exception of some contemporary pieces.

Prescreening & Audition:

Please prepare the following. All pieces should be performed from memory and complete, i.e. not just parts, sections, or movements.

- An original Baroque work (no transcriptions)
- Complete Classical sonata
- Large Romantic work
- Virtuoso etude
- 20th or 21st century work (works written after 1950 are encouraged)

Music DMA

Prescreening & Audition:

Please prepare a full recital of at least 70 minutes, with repertoire of the applicant's choice. The repertoire must reflect the applicant's interests but should include a complete classical work such as a complete Haydn, Mozart or Beethoven sonata or set of variations, as well as a work written after 1950, or an earlier work that represents modernism. The applicant should be able to discuss their submitted program and explain how their choice represents the applicant artistically. For the prescreening recordings, a minimum of 50 minutes of the 70-minute program is required.
