- Died January 27, 1945 in Auschwitz-Birkenau

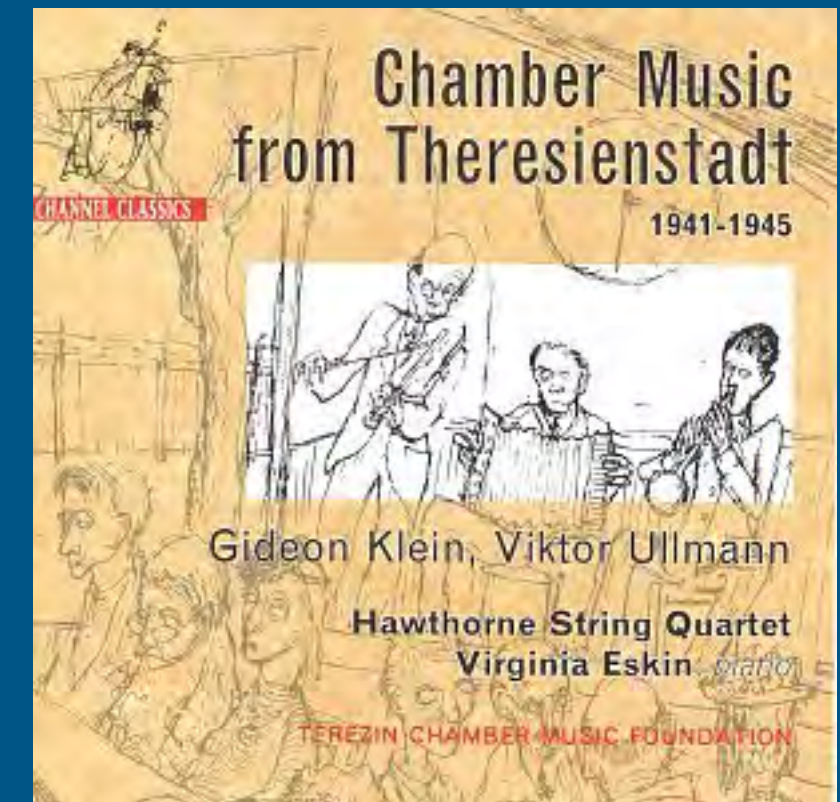


GIDEON KLEIN

- Died March 25, 1972 in Lodz, Poland

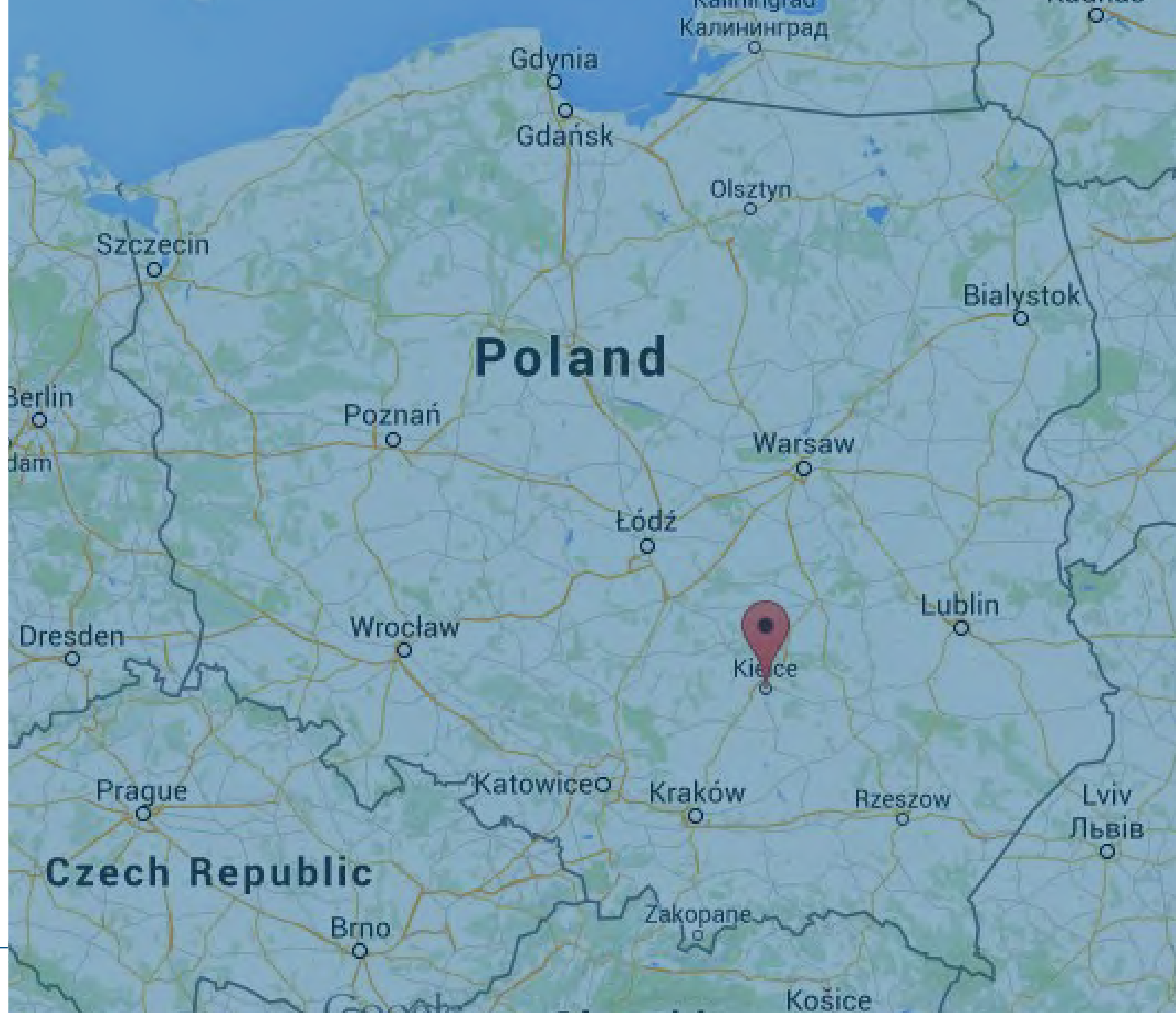
