8. Kun Opera Aria

The Palace of Eternal Life - Emperor's Propose (Chang Sheng Dian - Ding Qing) ------ Hong Sheng (1649-1704)

Emperor's Propose (Ding Qing) - an aria from the Kun opera The Palace of Eternal Life (Chang Sheng Dian) completed in 1688. The Palace of Eternal Life tells the love story of Emperor Tang Xuanzong (713-756 AD) and his favorite concubine Yang Yuhuan in Tang Dynasty (618-907AD). The scene concerns Emperor Tang gives Yang a gold hairpin and a jewel box to pledge their love on the Chinese Valentine's Day in 751AD in front of the Palace of Eternal Life. They wish the whole world to witness their vow of being husband and wife in every fresh life as the earth endures. Kun opera is often described as China's "classical" opera; the main melodic accompanying instrument is the dizi (transverse bamboo flute).

Pour Cup Music (Qing Bei Yue) ----- Choreographed by Chi Li

Dunhuang dance Pour Cup Music (Qing Bei Yue) is a Tang Dynasty style dance performance. The music Qing Bei Yue is arranged from a melody of <Dunhuang Ancient music Manuscript> which came from the Dunhuang Grottoes. The Dunhuang Grottoes is located in southeast China, constructed between 4th and 14th century. This dance movement is created with the images from the Dunhuang murals. The special gestures including Lotus pose, Orchid shaped fingers, Antler pose, etc.

11. Erhu Solo

Impressions of Guan-dong (Guan Dong Xu Yu) ------ Chi Lyu

Arranged by Yanbin Li

Guan-dong region is located in Northeast China. "Impressions of Guan-dong" is a single-movement concerto consisting of multiple sections. It was composed based on the melody of the Northeastern Chinese folk song "Crescent Moon". The expressive and dulcet melody, together with a dynamic and mesmerizing rhythm, depicts and eulogizes the beauty of Guan-dong, the passionate and persevering Northeastern people, and their aspirations for a better future.

12. Narrative Music - Pingtan

Baoyu's Night Visit - Dream of the Red Chamber (Baoyu Ye Tan) ------ Traditional Narrative music

Pingtan is a story-telling folk art tradition that originated in the city of Suzhou, first popularized in the Jiangnan region during the Qing dynasty. The art form is characterized by the incorporation of talking, joking, singing, and acting, and the adoption of accompanying instruments like sanxian and pipa.

Bao Yu's Night Visit (Bao Yu Ye Tan) is an excerpt from a long-length story-telling ping tan series adapted from the famous novel Dream of the Red Chamber originally written in the 18th century. The novel depicts the rise and fall of an aristocratic clan during the Qing dynasty. This segment is a narration of the main character Jia Bao Yu visiting his sickness-ridden cousin Lin Dai Yu—whose romance with Bao Yu eventually ends in tragedy.

13. Erhu and Zheng Duet

Mongolian reed whistle (*Hu Jia*) ------Ancient Music

The main melody of this erhu and zheng duet is adapted from Qin Songs "Grand Hu Jia" and "Little Hu Jia". The lyrics were composed by the poet and musician Cai Wen Ji who lived during the late Eastern Han Dynasty (2nd century AD). She spent part of her life as a captive of the Xiongnu nomadic tribe which brought her thousands of miles away from her home. The music expresses Cai Wenji's conflicted and painful feelings of missing her homeland while also unwilling to let go of her young children who were born in and belong to the tribe. The melancholy and desolate emotions are deeply contained within the music.

In the U.S., she has been featured in concerts held at prestigious venues such as Madison Square Garden (New York), Ronald Reagan Building (Washington D.C.), and Avery Fisher Hall/Lincoln Center (New York). She is a recording soloist for the 2019 Oscar – Best Animated short film "Bao".
